## A. CONDITIONS

- (1) The 140th Open Championship will be decided by stroke play over four rounds of 18 holes in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by R&A Rules Limited and in accordance with the Local Rules approved by R&A Championships Limited.
- (2) In the event of a tie after four rounds, the winner will be decided by a play-off by stroke play over four holes. The play-off will start as soon as practicable after the last players have finished their round.  
The player with the lowest aggregate over the four extra holes will be declared the winner. If the players are still tied having played these four holes, a hole by hole play-off will be played immediately over the 18th hole only until a winner emerges. If the play-off involves more than 2 players, those other than the winner will be deemed to have tied for 2nd place regardless of their scores in the play-off.
- (3) The starting field will be 156 players. The 70 lowest scores over the first 36 holes and any tying for 70th place will qualify for the 3rd round on Saturday 16 July and the 4th round on Sunday 17 July. If a competitor who has posted a two round total score that will qualify for the 3rd round, withdraws before or after the 3rd round draw is made, the competitor's score will still be used to calculate the leading 70 places and ties that will determine the cut mark.
- (4) In the event of play being either delayed or declared null and void for any round of the Championship, additional play will be at the discretion of the Championship Committee. Additional play will take place on Monday 18 July and exceptionally Tuesday 19 July.
- (5) R&A Championships Limited arranges publicity before and during the Championship in the Press and by live and recorded radio and television broadcasting and filming and on the Internet. Each competitor by entering the Championship and by agreeing to these terms and conditions assigns to R&A Championships Limited and its assignees and licensees the right in perpetuity throughout the world to make, use, exhibit and reproduce in any way now known or hereafter devised (and to authorise others to do so) for commercial and other purposes from time to time and at their discretion, motion pictures, still pictures, live taped or filmed television, sound recordings and any other reproductions of any description of the competitor made during or in connection with the Championship (including, without limitation, during practice and play) without compensation for the competitor or the heirs, successors, executors, administrators or assignees of the competitor. The competitor also assigns the right to use and reproduce the competitor's name, voice, likeness and biographical material in any way now known or hereafter devised by R&A Championships Limited for the purpose of promoting the Championship and any subsequent Open Championships, without compensation for the competitor or the heirs, successors, executors, administrators or assignees of the competitor including in circumstances where it may include the logo of a third party or of a sponsor or patron of the Championship or any subsequent Open Championship or any other activities undertaken by R&A Championships Limited. Competitors shall be responsible for ensuring that their caddies will assign to R&A Championships Limited and its successors and licensees equivalent rights in relation to the caddie. Notwithstanding the foregoing grant of rights, R&A Championships Limited and its assignees and licensees agree that, other than as permitted above, they will not authorise any company contractually associated with R&A Championships Limited to use the competitor's name, voice, likeness and biographical material in a way which constitutes the endorsement of a product or service, without first requiring such associated company to obtain the competitor's authorisation. Also, to comply with certain contractual limitations relating to advertising on television, competitors assent that they or their caddies may not, without the prior approval of R&A Championships Limited, display any commercial identification on clothing or equipment other than that customarily affixed to and of the normal size and in the normal position on any such clothing or equipment. The winner shall be entitled to use the Championship Trophy for promotional purposes with commercial partners, but such use shall not be excessive, and shall be in good taste and respectful of the tradition and prestige of the Championship. As the owner of all intellectual property rights in and to the Championship Trophy, The R&A may, in its sole discretion, deem any commercial use of the Championship Trophy to be unsuitable, and in such event the winner shall ensure that such use is discontinued.
- (6) Competitors shall at all times be liable for the actions of their caddies and shall ensure that the caddies comply with the Conditions as they apply to the competitors. Competitors shall ensure that their caddies wear clothing of a type appropriate to The Open Championship and, in particular, caddies shall be required to wear an Open Championship over-garment or bib of a type and design as shall be supplied by the Championship Committee. Caddies will be required to wear such an over-garment or bib during official practice rounds and during the Championship. Competitors' caddies may not wear headgear, visors or any other items of clothing which displays a logo other than the official Open Championship logo unless such logo represents a contract to which the competitor was bound at the commencing date of the Championship or an existing contract to which the caddie was bound as at 1 February 2011.
- (7) All competitors gaining entry to The Open Championship itself are subject to the provisions of the PGA European Tour's Anti-Doping Policy in force at the date of the Championship. Details of the Policy, and the Prohibited Substances and Prohibited Methods, are available from R&A Championships Limited. Competitors who are taking medication and in doubt as to their clinical status should seek advice from R&A Championships Limited not later than 21 days before the start of the Championship.
- (8) A copy of the full pace of play conditions will be posted at each Championship venue and will be available on request.
- (9) The specimen conditions in the Rules of Golf are in effect for Driving Clubs, Conforming Golf Balls, One Ball Condition and Time of Starting. The specimen condition in Decision 4-1/1 of Decisions on the Rules of Golf is in effect for Grooves and Punch Marks, except all RQ competitions.
- (10) Competitors must not ride on any form of transportation during a stipulated round unless authorised by the Championship Committee.
- (11) The Championship Committee reserves the right to amend the Championship conditions and the decision of the Committee will, in all matters, be final.
- (12) These terms and conditions shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the law of Scotland.

## B. QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS

For those entrants not exempt into the Championship under section F, the qualifying procedure will be as follows:

### INTERNATIONAL FINAL QUALIFYING (IFQ)

- (1) IFQ of 36 holes stroke play will be played in 2011 on Tuesday 11 January at Kingston Heath, Melbourne, Australia (Australasia), on Wednesday 19 & Thursday 20 January at Royal Johannesburg & Kensington, Johannesburg, South Africa (Africa), on Thursday 24 & Friday 25 February at Amata Spring Country Club, Bangkok, Thailand (Asia), on Monday 23 May at Gleneagles G & CC, Dallas, Texas, USA (America) and on Monday 6 June at Sunningdale, Berkshire, England (Europe).
- (2) Entrants fulfilling the conditions of sections D(1), D(2), D(3) or D(4) may attempt to qualify through either IFQ or LFQ but not both.
- (3) The entrant may play in only one IFQ.
- (4) Each IFQ starting field will not exceed 78 players except IFQ Europe which will not exceed 96 players. If the field of any IFQ does not exceed 20 that particular competition may be cancelled. The entrants concerned may enter a subsequent IFQ or LFQ.
- (5) 3 places each for IFQ Africa and IFQ Australasia, 4 places for IFQ Asia, 8 places for IFQ America and 10 places for IFQ Europe will be available directly into the Championship. Any alteration in the number of available places will be decided by the Championship Committee at its discretion, having regard to the relative strength and size of each IFQ field. Any competitor who has qualified through IFQ is deemed an Exempt Player.
- (6) Ties for last qualifying places in each IFQ will be decided by hole by hole play-off as soon as is practicable after the last players have finished play.
- (7) In the event of play being either delayed or declared null and void for any round of IFQ, additional play will be at the discretion of the Championship Committee and may take place on the day following each IFQ.  
The qualifying places available at a cancelled IFQ will be allocated to players in the starting field of that IFQ in OWGR order on the date of cancellation. Other competitors will have their entrance fees refunded in full.

**LOCAL FINAL QUALIFYING (LFQ)**

- (8) Separate LFQ of 36 holes each will be played by stroke play on Tuesday 28 June 2011 at Littlestone, Prince's, Royal Cinque Ports and Rye.
- (9) For LFQ, the field will be divided evenly between the designated courses. 12 places will be reserved from LFQ for the Championship and these will also be so divided. Any competitor who has qualified through LFQ is deemed an Exempt Player.
- (10) Ties for last qualifying places in each competition will be decided by hole by hole play-off as soon as practicable after the last players have finished play.
- (11) In the event of play being either delayed or declared null and void for either round of any LFQ, additional play will be at the discretion of the Championship Committee.

**REGIONAL QUALIFYING (RQ)**

- (12) To determine qualifiers to LFQ, separate RQ of 18 holes each will be played by stroke play on Monday 20 June 2011 at Abridge, Berwick-upon-Tweed (Goswick), Bruntsfield Links, Buckinghamshire, Clitheroe, Coventry, East Sussex National, Enville, Ferndown, Gog Magog, Hankley Common, Lindrick, Mere, Pannal, Royal Dublin and The London. If the entry exceeds the number that can be accommodated at these courses, additional courses may be added. It may not be possible to allocate all entrants to their preferred courses.
- (13) Entrants must intimate on their entry form which RQ courses they wish to play. If the field of any of these competitions does not exceed 40 that particular competition may be cancelled and the entrants concerned required to play in another RQ. After allowing for players who fulfill the conditions under section E, the number of qualifying places available in LFQ will be determined by the size of each field.
- (14) Ties for last qualifying places in each competition will be decided by hole by hole play-off as soon as practicable after the last players finish their round.
- (15) Irrespective of play-off places, see B(14), reserve places in case of subsequent withdrawals from LFQ will be decided by a card countback, if necessary, from each RQ competition. The card countback will use the second 9 holes or 6 or 3 or 2 or 1 hole and, if a tie still arises, the last 6 or 3 or 2 or 1 hole of the first 9 holes and, if a tie still arises, by the drawing of lots.
- (16) In the event of play being incomplete or declared null and void on Monday 20 June, the competition will continue or take place on Tuesday 21 June at the same venue and at the same starting times. In the event of play being declared null and void on Tuesday 21 June, the competition will be cancelled and entrance fees refunded in full. No competitors will go forward from that competition to LFQ.

**C. ENTRIES**

- (1) Entry into RQ will be accepted from any male professional golfer, from a male amateur golfer whose playing handicap does not exceed SCRATCH and from any female golfer in
  - (i) The top 5 and ties in the 2011 Kraft Nabisco Championship.
  - (ii) The top 5 and ties in the 2010 LPGA Championship.
  - (iii) The top 5 and ties in the 2010 US Women's Open Championship.
  - (iv) The top 5 and ties in the 2010 RICOH Women's British Open Championship.
- (2) Entry into IFQ, LFQ or The Open will be accepted from any golfer who fulfils the conditions in section D, section E or section F respectively.
- (3) Amateur entrants from Great Britain & Ireland shall be under the current CONGU handicapping scheme or from outside Great Britain & Ireland, under the handicapping scheme adopted by the recognised authority controlling golf in the country from which they enter.
- (4) Amateur entrants from Great Britain & Ireland must enter through the Secretary of their Home Club. Amateur entrants from the USA shall enter through their home State Association. Other amateur entrants from outside Great Britain & Ireland shall enter through the Secretary of the recognised authority controlling golf in the country from which they enter.
- (5) Entries to IFQ must be received by the Entries Department no later than the respective closing date for entries. All other entries must be received by the Entries Department no later than Thursday 26 May 2011.
- (6) Entries shall be accepted by the Entries Department only if the entry form is fully completed and signed by the entrant.
- (7) Entrance fees will not be refunded unless intimation of withdrawal is received before the respective closing date for entries. An administrative charge of £20 will be deducted from all refunds.
- (8) The Championship Committee may require independent certified evidence of the playing ability of entrants.
- (9) All entries will be subject to the approval of the Championship Committee which reserves the right to accept or refuse, or having accepted, subsequently reject any entry without giving reason for a decision.
- (10) The Championship Committee reserves the right to disqualify any competitor making a false statement on his entry form.

**D. ENTRY AT INTERNATIONAL FINAL QUALIFYING STAGE is open to:**

- (1) Past Open Champions.
- (2) The Asian Amateur Champion and runners-up (IFQ Australasia or IFQ Asia only).
- (3) Any player with OWGR pointage at date of entry. A place in the starting field of IFQ will be subject to OWGR ranking on the closing date.
- (4) Anyone who played in the 2010 Open Championship at St Andrews.  
D(2) is only applicable if the entrant concerned is still an amateur on 11 January 2011 (IFQ Australasia) or on tbc (IFQ Asia).

**E. ENTRY AT LOCAL FINAL QUALIFYING STAGE is open to:**

- (1) Past Open Champions.
- (2) Any player with OWGR pointage at date of entry who has not been accepted into the starting field of any 2010 IFQ or has not entered IFQ.
- (3) Anyone who played in the 2010 Open Championship at St Andrews.
- (4) First 10 and anyone tying for 10th place in the 2010 PGA Glenmuir Club Professional Championship.
- (5) First 10 and anyone tying for 10th place in the 2010 PGA of America Club Professional Championship.
- (6) Past playing members of Ryder and Presidents Cup teams.
- (7) Playing members of the 5 leading teams and ties in the 2010 Eisenhower Trophy.
- (8) The Amateur Champions 2006-2010.
- (9) The US Amateur Champions 2005-2009.
- (10) The European Amateur Champions 2005-2009.
- (11) The 2010 English, Scottish and Welsh Amateur Champions.
- (12) The Irish Amateur Champion. Blank entry will be made on behalf of the 2011 Champion.
- (13) The runners-up in each of the 2011 Amateur Championship, for whom a blank entry will be made, the 2010 US Amateur Championship, 2010 European Amateur Championship.
- (14) The leading 10 R&A World Amateur Golf Ranked entrants, not otherwise exempt, as at WAGR Week 22.  
E(7) to E(14) are only applicable if the entrant concerned is still an amateur on 28 June 2011.

**F. PLAYERS EXEMPT FROM REGIONAL, LOCAL FINAL AND INTERNATIONAL FINAL QUALIFYING**

- (1) Past Open Champions aged 60 or under on 17 July 2011.
- (2) The Open Champions for 2001-2010.
- (3) Past Open Champions born between 17 July 1945 and 19 July 1948.
- (4) Past Open Champions finishing in the first 10 and tying for 10th place in The Open Championship 2006-2010.

- (5) First 10 and anyone tying for 10th place in the 2010 Open Championship at St Andrews.
  - (6) The first 50 players on the OWGR for Week 22, Monday 30 May 2011. Blank entries will be made on behalf of players qualifying in this category.
  - (7) First 30 in the Race to Dubai for 2010.
  - (8) The BMW PGA Championship winners for 2009-2011. Blank entries will be made on behalf of players qualifying in this category.
  - (9) First 3 and anyone tying for 3rd place, not otherwise exempt, in the top 20 of the Race to Dubai for 2011 on completion of the 2011 BMW PGA Championship. Blank entries will be made on behalf of players qualifying in this category.
  - (10) First 2 European Tour members and any European Tour members tying for 2nd place, not otherwise exempt, in a cumulative money list taken from the 6 official European Tour events leading up to and including the 2011 BMW International Open. (The BMW PGA Championship, The Celtic Manor Wales Open, The BMW Italian Open, The US Open Championship, The St Omer Open and the BMW International Open). Blank entries will be made on behalf of players qualifying in this category.
  - (11) The leading player, not otherwise exempt, in the first 5 and ties of each of the 2011 Open de France ALSTOM and the 2011 Barclays Scottish Open. With the exception of ties for first place, which will be determined in accordance with the Conditions for the tournament concerned, ties will be decided in favour of the highest OWGR player at the commencement of the tournament. Blank entries will be made on behalf of players qualifying in this category.
  - (12) The US Open Champions for 2007-2011. Blank entry will be made on behalf of the 2011 Champion.
  - (13) The US Masters Champions for 2007-2011.
  - (14) The US PGA Champions for 2006-2010.
  - (15) The PLAYERS Champions for 2009-2011.
  - (16) The leading 30 qualifiers for the 2010 TOUR CHAMPIONSHIP.
  - (17) First 3 and anyone tying for 3rd place, not exempt and having applied F(6), in the top 20 of the USPGA TOUR FedExCup Points List for 2011 on completion of the Crowne Plaza Invitational at Colonial.
  - (18) First 2 USPGA TOUR members and any USPGA TOUR members tying for 2nd place, not exempt, in a cumulative money list taken from the USPGA TOUR PLAYERS Championship and the five USPGA TOUR events leading up to and including the 2011 AT&T National. Blank entries will be made on behalf of players qualifying in this category. (THE PLAYERS Championship, The Memorial, St Jude Classic, US Open, Travelers championship and AT&T National)
  - (19) The leading player, not exempt having applied F(18) above, in the first 5 and ties of each of the 2011 AT&T National and the 2011 John Deere Classic. With the exception of ties for first place, which will be determined in accordance with the Conditions for the tournament concerned, ties will be decided in favour of the highest OWGR player at the commencement of the tournament. Blank entries will be made on behalf of players qualifying in this category.
  - (20) Playing members of the 2010 Ryder Cup teams.
  - (21) First and anyone tying for 1st place on the Order of Merit of the Asian Tour for 2010.
  - (22) First and anyone tying for 1st place on the Order of Merit of the Tour of Australasia for 2010.
  - (23) First and anyone tying for 1st place on the Order of Merit of the Southern Africa PGA Sunshine Tour for 2010.
  - (24) The Japan Open Champion for 2010.
  - (25) First 2 and anyone tying for 2nd place, not exempt, on the Official Money List of the Japan Golf Tour for 2010.
  - (26) The leading 4 players, not exempt, in the 2011 Mizuno Open. With the exception of ties for first place, which will be determined in accordance with the Conditions for the tournament concerned, ties will be decided in favour of the highest OWGR player at the commencement of the tournament. Blank entries will be made on behalf of players qualifying in this category.
  - (27) First 2 and anyone tying for 2nd place, not exempt having applied F(26) above, in a cumulative money list taken from all official 2011 Japan Golf Tour events up to and including the 2011 Mizuno Open. Blank entries will be made on behalf of players qualifying in this category.
  - (28) The Senior Open Champion for 2010.
  - (29) The Amateur Champion for 2011. Blank entry will be made on behalf of the Champion.
  - (30) The US Amateur Champion for 2010.
  - (31) The European Amateur Champion for 2010.
- F(29) to F(31) are only applicable if the entrant concerned is still an amateur on 14 July 2011.

#### G. THE STARTING FIELD

In the event of an exempt player withdrawing from the Championship or further places becoming available in the starting field after close of entries, these places will be allocated in ranking order of entrants from OWGR at the time that intimation of withdrawal is received or further places are made available by the Championship Committee. Any withdrawals following issue of OWGR Week 27 will be taken in ranking order from OWGR Week 27.

If a player, having entered, withdraws or otherwise fails to play in any round of any qualifying event, without satisfactory explanation, the Committee reserves the right to not accept an entry into The Open from that player in any subsequent year or years.

#### H. REGISTRATION

##### IFQ AND LFQ

Competitors must register at the course where they are playing by 12 noon BST on the day prior to the start of the competition. If unable to register in person, competitors may indicate their time of arrival and address for the duration of the competition to the Committee at the venue at which they are playing by telephone or fax to be received before 12 noon BST on the day prior to the start of the competition. The Committee must receive telephone calls personally. A competitor's place may be forfeited if contact has not been made by the stipulated time.

##### THE OPEN

Competitors must register at Royal St George's between 9am BST on Sunday 10 July and 6pm BST on Tuesday 12 July 2011. If unable to register in person, a competitor may indicate his time of arrival and address for the duration of the Championship by telephone or fax to be received before 6pm BST on Tuesday 12 July. Telephone calls must be received at the Championship Office. A competitor's place may be forfeited if contact has not been made by the stipulated time.

#### I. PRIZES

The winner will be the Champion Golfer of the year and will receive the Championship Trophy, which will be held for that year, and the Championship Gold Medal. The trophy shall be returned in time for the following Championship to an address to be ordered by the Chief Executive but the winner will receive a replica for retention. The runner(s)-up will receive a Silver Salver. The leading amateur in the Championship, unless the winner, will receive a Silver Medal on completion of 72 holes. Other amateurs who complete 72 holes will each receive a Bronze Medal.

Prize money shall be allocated to professional golfers. Players who are disqualified or withdraw from the Championship at any stage or for any reason shall forfeit all prize money. The Championship Committee at its total discretion may waive or otherwise amend this condition. If an amateur golfer wins any qualifying competition, he will receive a memento after the Championship.

THE OPEN If more than 70 professional golfers qualify for the final two rounds, additional prize money will be added.

IFQ In each competition, prize money will be allocated to the first four places.

LFQ In each competition, prize money will be allocated to the first three places.

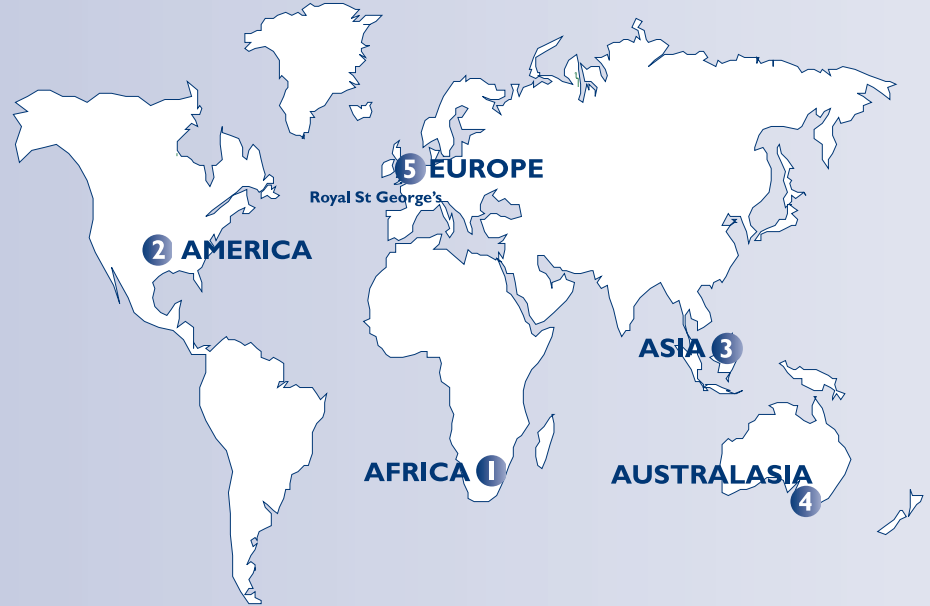

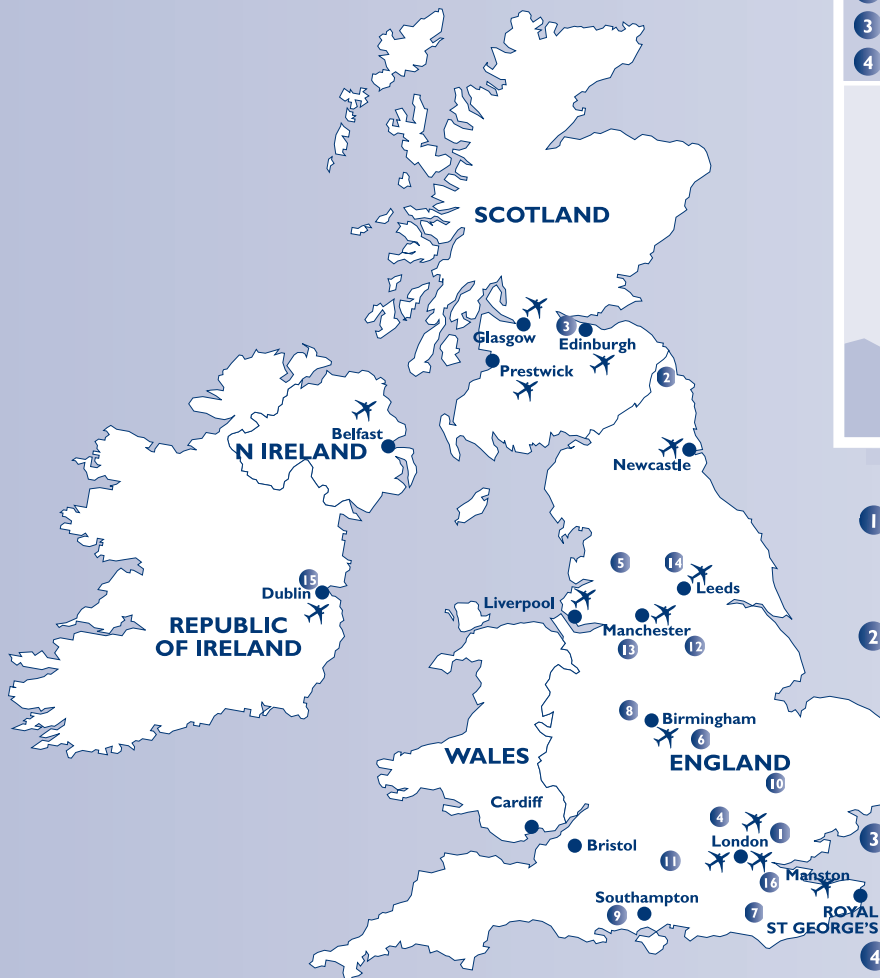
